Responsibilities

The Commercial Analyst's key role is to analyse co-funded projects across a range of EECA programmes and develop strong publishable case studies. These will demonstrate to the market place the current commercial and technical viability of energy efficiency, emission reduction, and transport technologies and relevant related processes.

The Commercial Analyst will also contribute to team analytical tasks as time permits. This will include up to date assessments of the commercial viability of various technologies and fuel types and the required "tipping point" to see these widely adopted. Tasks may also include impact measurement and assessment and financial analysis of programme interventions, and grant funding applications to EECA. Also expected is identifying and implementing improvement opportunities as well as identifying barriers and solutions to overcome them.
