Responsibilities

The purpose of the Standards and Technical team is to develop policies and standards which will influence behavioural and technological change throughout New Zealand; collecting product performance and other market information relevant to consumer education.

The Technical Analyst will provide general technical and analytical support to support the development, delivery and operation of EECA's regulatory programme. They will contribute to the end-to-end management of technical product and application data. This includes collection, verification, analysis as well as developing and maintaining systems that underpin this function. They will contribute to assigned standards and technical projects.


