Thank you for your email of 22 February 2022 in which you requested information about the travel undertaken by the Chief Executive of EECA. Specifically, you requested:

"A list of all the flights the CEO of EECA went on in 2020, 2021 and Jan-Feb 2022.


A list of the departure city/town and arrival city/town; the cost of each flight; and the specific reason for travelling (including how it relates to EECA's purpose)."

As the attached table shows, the EECA Chief Executive always seeks to optimise any visits outside of Wellington. This includes taking meetings with a wide range of stakeholders and direct engagement customers (e.g. large energy users) and key service providers on the visits. These visits are all taken because they align with, and help to advance, EECA's strategic purpose which is to *mobilise New Zealanders to be world leaders in clean and clever energy use*.

On the infrequent occasion that the return leg of a trip flies to a non-Wellington destination (i.e. for non-work, practicality purposes), the price difference between this and the equivalent Wellington-bound flight is paid for by the Chief Executive.

You have the right, by way of complaint to the Ombudsman, to seek an investigation and review of the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Authority's response to your information request.
