Re: Official Information Act Request: Agency-level government fleet and EV charging data

Thank you for your email to Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) on 30 July 2026 requesting information under the Official Information Act 1982. The following part of your request was transferred from MBIE to EECA on 12 August 2026:

'The number of EV chargers funded for each agency under the State Sector Decarbonisation Fund or any successor programme, and the associated funding amounts'.

Please note the approved co-funding amounts presented in Appendix 1 are recorded at the project level and therefore relate to both Electric Vehicles (EVs) and EV chargers. These approved co-funding amounts do not distinguish between whether or not the project has been since been completed or the actual project costs.

Appendix One:

The EVs and EV chargers approved for co-funding under the State Sector Decarbonisation Fund (SSDF) and the Carbon Neutral Government Programme (CNGP) programme.

The SSDF approved a total of \$34,780,749 in co-funding for 1141 electric vehicles (EV) and 1115 EV chargers. A project-based breakdown of the number of EVs, EV chargers, and associated SSDF co-funding amount for each state sector agency can be found below in **Table 1**.

With \$31.5 million of co-funding from the SSDF and CNGP, a further 1250 EVs and 1327 EV chargers were also approved to be obtained through lease arrangements. For these leased EVs and EV chargers, a project-based breakdown by state sector agency and approved co-funding amounts can be found below in **Table 2**.
